





Men's EHF EURO 2020 - Media Accreditation Terms and Conditions

1. Introduction

The European Handball Federation (EHF), Men's EHF EURO 2020 Organising Committee (OC) and Infront, the federation's exclusive media and marketing partner for the EHF EURO events, recognise the importance of top quality media coverage of the EHF EURO and strive to offer the highest standard of media services for accredited media representatives. These terms and conditions set out the conditions under which the EHF provides a successful applicant with an accreditation and access to the EHF EURO venues.

2. Applying for an accreditation

Applications will only be accepted via the dedicated EHF EURO online accreditation system within the specified time period. Email accreditation requests will not be accepted. Requests submitted after the published deadline will not be processed.

By submitting a request for an accreditation, the applicant confirms that this is made with the full knowledge and consent of his/her employer and that he/she is authorised to enter into this legally binding agreement for him/herself and his/her employer.

Applicants must be aged 18 or over to receive a media accreditation.

3. Applying for an accreditation (written media/photographers)

A media accreditation is only open to professional media representatives working at the event for a recognised media outlet. Media representatives, and in particular freelancers, may also be asked to provide additional evidence of their work and previous coverage of handball events.

4. Applying for an accreditation (TV and radio)

Infront, the EHF's official media and marketing partner for EHF EURO events, is responsible for all accreditation requests from TV (including web TV) and radio representatives. Before making an accreditation request, an agreement concerning the relevant media rights must be reached with Infront well in advance of the deadline for media accreditation applications. 5. Confirmation/denial of accreditation request

All applicants will be informed by email whether their application has been successful. Acceptance of an accreditation request is entirely at the discretion of the EHF and Infront. The EHF and/or Infront may accept or reject accreditation requests entirely at its own discretion and can impose further terms and conditions. Given that there are limited media places available, it may not be possible to accept all requests for a media accreditation.







6. Collection of accreditations

Accreditations may only be picked up by the bearer and not by a representative unless agreed otherwise. Accreditations will only be issued on receipt of a valid photographic identification (e.g. passport, drivers licence) together with a copy of the confirmation email. Accreditations can only be picked up from the accreditation centre at the arrival venue indicated in the course of the application process or as informed to the EHF prior to the event.

7. Use of accreditation

Media representatives must wear their accreditation visible at all times in the event arena on both match and non-match days, as well as training sessions. Accreditations are only valid together with a valid photographic identification (e.g. passport or driving licence), which the media representative may be required to produce at any time.

Accredited media representatives are only allowed in the designated zones as displayed on their accreditation and must follow the signposted routing within the playing arena.

Accreditations are non-transferrable and may only be used by the bearer and may not be assigned to any other person. In case the bearer loses the accreditation, he/she must contact EHF and/or Infront immediately.

The EHF reserves the right to charge a fee of €100 for the loss of an accreditation. Each application for a reprint will be handled separately. Lost accreditations will be cancelled in order to prevent and avoid misuse.

8. Conduct and withdrawal of accreditations

Media representatives who do not comply with the Terms and Conditions before or during the event will have their accreditation withdrawn and may be restricted from attending future EHF events as a media representative.

The EHF and/or Infront may ask an accredited media representative to substantiate their work at any time before, during or after the event. In this case the evidence must be provided within 24 hours of the request. Should this evidence not be provided, the EHF and/or Infront may withdraw the accreditation.

Accredited media representatives must behave in an orderly manner – befitting of the Terms and Conditions of the EHF EURO Events – throughout the event. Any abusive behaviour or unbecoming conduct will result in expulsion from all venues.

Once an accreditation is granted, it may be revoked at any time without liability for compensation to the applicant. The accreditation of any person found to be accredited under false pretenses will be invalidated immediately.







9. Media rights

No video recording is allowed in the arena for other than TV rights holders on match days or any other person authorized by Infront on match days.

TV rights holders agree to use video material from the EHF EURO only for broadcasting on television (except for such rights holders with an agreement for internet distribution).

TV rights holders are only permitted to hold interviews in the mixed zone and (super) flash zone in front of the official advertising backdrop boards.

Non-rights holders (NRH) are not permitted to film anywhere in the playing arena on match days at any time (including the mixed zone) but are permitted to record (video/audio) the press conference for broadcast use. Non-rights holders may access the written media/non-rights holders area of the mixed zone to obtain written quotes only.

The rules relating to video recording/broadcasting for rights holders/non-rights holders also apply to the use of mobile streaming apps such as Facebook Live, Instagram Live, Twitter Live or similar within the playing arena.

Media representatives are not permitted (unless with permissions and approved accreditation) to provide audio or video broadcasts to their respective website at any time, nor are they permitted to provide online scoring/statistics from an internet connection, or any other connection, to their respective website during the game.

Media representatives and/or photographers are allowed to use pictures from EHF EURO events only for publication in editorial text and must guarantee not to play any moving picture sequences (max. sequence is five pictures / sec.) on the internet or to publish pictures on the internet which have been electronically modified or adapted. They agree not to sell pictures for commercial or advertising use without the written authorisation of the EHF or Infront.

All members and delegates of national federations and teams are allowed to use pictures for private or technical study purposes only unless, in the case of a federation's media staff for example, agreed with the EHF/Infront prior to the event. Teams are permitted to take video recordings of matches with one camera and one person who is in possession of an official team accreditation (issued by the EHF). He/she must wear the bib provided and carry the official authorisation at all times. These video recordings must serve exclusively internal team and coaching analysis purposes. It is strictly prohibited to use them for commercial purposes.

10. Written media

Written media representatives will be provided with seating in the stands with access to table and electricity. Internet access is guaranteed in all venues as is mobile phone reception. At peak times during the event work spaces may be limited, priority will be given to representatives from those countries playing. Seats and tables may not be reserved. After the end of the match, members of the written press are permitted to conduct interviews in the 'written media' areas of the mixed zone. Media representatives may record audio for their own personal working use only and may not share or broadcast this content.







11. Photographers

Designated areas (with seats) are provided for photographers behind the goals, at each end of the court behind the advertising boards. Photographers will be advised before the match of any additionally designated areas where they may take photos within the playing arena.

Photographers may sit between the catch net and the advertising board. The catch net will be fixed three metres either side of the goal, for their own safety photographers may not sit in this area. Photographers are not allowed sit or stand in front of or to obstruct the view of the advertising boards.

Photograph bibs should be worn at all times. Bibs can be collected from the Media Centre, a refundable deposit will be required.

Photographers are required to attend the photographer briefings held prior to each round of the competition.

Photographs can be taken during the player line-up. An area will be defined before the match for this purpose. Photographers may stand in this position until the pre-match procedure is over and must then return to their designated permission.

Photographers have to remain seated and cannot change seats/ends during the match. Positions can only be changed during the half-time break or following the end of the match. If a photographer wishes to change ends during the half-time break, he/she must follow the official routing system.

It is not allowed to stand behind the player seats, behind the official table or on the opposite side of the court.

Photographers are only allowed to enter the court following the match for 3/4 place and final when permitted to do so and only in the designated area. An area in front of the timekeepers' table will be reserved for photographers and Infront-approved ENG crews.

Strobe light photography is not permitted.

Photographers may not reserve places in their designated areas. An area for official EHF photographers may however be reserved. Access to the mixed zone is not allowed at any time on match days.

12. TV/radio

TV camera stickers will be issued by Infront on-site to TV rights holders and non-rights holders (there are no stickers for radio stations). These stickers have to be clearly displayed on all recording equipment.

All media representatives with access to the area which surrounds the playing court are requested to wear a bib and accreditation at all times. Bibs will be distributed by Infront on-site.







Based on their unilateral bookings, Infront approved ENG Technical Crews are requested to wear a bib at all times in the playing arena, for ease of recognition, and observe the routing systems and court procedures. The bib and accreditation is only

valid for specific matches, where a contractual agreement has been reached. The TV bibs must be handed back after each match day to Infront/host broadcaster or on request of the EHF.

Infront will inform approved ENG Crews where they are allowed to move within the playing court surrounding area. During the matches, Infront-approved ENG crews have to stay in their designated and signposted areas behind the advertising boards close to each corner of the playing court, unless otherwise instructed. Only the Host Broadcaster is permitted to access the playing court.

All media representatives granted with special access to the area which surrounds the playing court (e.g. pitch reporters) have to remain seated and cannot change seat during play. It is not allowed to change the designated areas at the end of the playing courts during a match. Changing position is only permitted at the half-time break or at the end of the match according to the routing system.

It is not allowed to stand behind the player seats, behind the official table or on the opposite side of the court without authorisation by the EHF. It is not allowed to obstruct the view of the advertising boards.

Commentators will have a designated working station if booked prior to the event. This will be equipped as agreed with Infront/the Host Broadcaster prior to the event.

The guidelines and instructions of the EHF, Infront, the Organising Committee and/or the host broadcaster must be followed at all times. No rights holder is permitted to interfere/obstruct in the work of the EHF, the OC and/or the host broadcaster.

There will be a designated photo and ENG area reserved for any award ceremonies from which the photographers and Infront approved ENG crews will be able to work.

13. TV studios

TV stations, which have studios within the arena, should contact Infront and the EHF concerning the routing of players after the match as special written permission may be needed to ensure efficient routing after the match.

Studio production is permitted during team training only when TV stations inform Infront 24 hours ahead of time of their daily filming schedule in order that team delegations can be informed of any clashes. If this requirement is fulfilled, filming in the studio is permitted but TV stations are not permitted to film team training sessions.

14. Flash zone

The holding of interviews in the flash zone is only permitted upon individual booking in good time and authorisation with Infront. Live TV rights holders whose teams are playing and who have made bookings confirmed by Infront are permitted to use this area (with special SAD - Special Access Devices, which will be distributed on-site by Infront). This area is reserved for TV stations from the countries which have played the match, unless an alternative agreement with Infront has been reached. In this case, the EHF







and the OC will be informed by Infront prior to the match in order to brief security personnel accordingly.

15. Mixed zone

The mixed zone will be divided and signposted into three zones (television, radio, written media/non-rights holders). After the end of the match, TV and radio rights holders are permitted to conduct interviews in the designated areas of the mixed zone. Only rights holders are permitted to record video and/or audio in the flash/mixed zones for broadcast use.

16. Open training sessions

All training sessions taking place in the playing arena are open to the media for filming and photography purposes only for the first 10 minutes. Interviews may not be carried out unless permitted by the team management. After the 10 minute period media representatives are requested to leave the playing hall.

17. EHF Media Portal

Additional media information, statistics and flash quotes from this event and other EHF competitions can be found in the EHF Media Portal. Media representatives can register for the media portal here: bit.ly/ehfmediaportal.

18. Data Related Matters

As an accredited media representative your accreditation data will be retained by the EHF, Infront and its partner Swiss Timing. This data will be treated in the strictest confidence and will only be shared with our partners Infront and the OC of the host nation(s) for the purposes of event organisation. We also reserve the right to share your data, according to the laws and regulations of the host nation(s), with law enforcement authorities in order to carry out any necessary security checks.

19. Data necessary for the accreditation process

20. Data use

We will only process personal data that you provide to us voluntarily and for the purposes for which you have given us the data. Otherwise, we will process your personal data to the extent it is necessary in particular for the performing of a contract to which you are party, or for the compliance with a legal obligation to which we are subject, and always in accordance with the Austrian, Swedish and Norwegian Data Protection law and the General Data Protection Regulation (short "GDPR"). Your data will not be transferred to third parties without your express consent and treated with utmost confidentiality.

We will process the personal data provided by you in the registration process for the following purposes:

- Use for the accreditation process of the event;
- Answering requests you made to us, including in a feedback form, by email, telephone or fax,
- Sending you emails with essential event information including news, media announcements and releases.
- Sending you a follow-up by email after the event.

You may revoke your consent at any time and without providing reasons, with effect for the future. If you revoke your consent to processing of data necessary for the accreditation process as indicated in the present terms and conditions, kindly note that we cannot process your accreditation request. In order to revoke your consent, please send us an email to media@eurohandball.com or a letter to the office address of the EHF. We may have to ask you for appropriate identification, depending on the type of data we have stored from you or not.

Should you <u>not wish</u> to receive further information from the EHF, you can unsubscribe at any time by contacting the EHF Media and Communications Department at media@eurohandball.com.

If you revoke your consent, we will delete any personal data for which we have no legal storage obligation and will restrict the processing of the stored data to the said purpose in the future. The EHF, Infront, the OC will **delete** any personal data at the latest seven (7) years after the last day of the year in which the event took place, unless there is a legal obligation of the EHF to process and / or store data for a longer period (e.g. invoices).

Furthermore, we wish to make you aware that you have further specific rights granted to you under the EU Data Protection Regulation ("GDRP") and the Austrian, Swedish and Norwegian Data Protection laws, in particular, but not limited to the rights to information which personal data and for which purposes they are stored and processed, to rectification of inaccurate personal data, a right to object and / or of restriction of the further processing of such data, and of data portability.

21. Data protection

The use and processing of personal data will be handled in line with the Austrian, Swedish and Norwegian data protection laws and the GDRP.

When you visit our website, or indeed any other website, certain data is automatically stored. To this extent, the name of your Internet service provider, the pages you visit, the website from which you have visited us and the date and duration of your visit will be stored, usually temporarily. Your privacy and right to confidentiality are protected as individual users remain anonymous.

22. Miscellaneous

In the event that any of the contents of these terms and conditions are ineffective, this will not affect the remainder of the contract or these terms and conditions.

In the event that the applicant is a registered merchant or a public law entity, the competent Court in Vienna (Austria) shall have exclusive jurisdiction on any disputes arising from these terms or their interpretation shall be exclusively governed by Austrian law.
